Getting to Havant (1)



Where is the European Training Centre?

Havant, UK

The European Training Centre is located in Havant, UK. Havant is a small town on the south coast of England, some 60 miles from London. The town boasts a good range of amenities, services and entertainment options for those travelling to the area.

Flying into the UK from Europe & overseas

The easiest way to reach Havant from abroad is to fly into Heathrow or Gatwick airport, both of which are around 60 miles from the Training Centre. It will take around 60-90 minutes to get from either airport to Havant.



Getting from the airport to Havant

The cheapest way to get from Heathrow or Gatwick airport to Havant is by taking the train to Havant Train Station. Train tickets can be booked online and in advance to get the best price for your journey (for example, using www.thetrainline.com). Tickets should cost around £20-40 per direction.

From Gatwick airport, there are trains every 30 minutes throughout the day. The journey to Havant will take 60-90 minutes.

From Heathrow airport, you must first take a bus (107) to Woking, duration 45 minutes. From there, it is a 1 minute walk to Woking Train Station. The train to Havant departs from platform 5, duration 50 minutes.

Train tickets can be bought using credit card or cash (GBP). Note that American Express is not widely used in the UK, so please make sure you have an alternative card (for example a Mastercard or VISA debit/credit card).

Some bus stations may have a ticket machine which accepts credit card payment (Mastercard or VISA debit/credit card) but cash (GBP) is the better choice here.

Other airports

Some visitors may also be able to make use of Southampton airport, which is only 22 miles from Havant. In this case, the cheapest way of travelling from the airport to Havant is by taxi. This should cost around £30. Note that cash (GBP) will be required to pay for the taxi. Tipping one or two pounds is a nice touch, but not absolutely expected.

Getting to Havant (2)



Travelling by Taxi

Instead of taking the train, another option (especially for larger groups), is to share a taxi. A taxi can be pre-booked from one of the following companies. Alternatively you may hail a taxi from outside the airport without prebooking, but beware, the price may be higher! Getting from Heathrow or Gatwick to Havant should cost around £100-150 (GBP). Note that cash (GBP) will be required to pay for the taxi. Tipping one or two pounds is a nice touch, but not absolutely expected.

Uber:

Uber is working fast and reliable in the UK. The benefit is that you will get a safe service, however you need to have the App set up in your mobile phone, and can set it up only with Visa or MasterCard. Using Uber can, in some circumstances, save you around 10% compared to traditional taxi companies.

Larger groups of people. This may be a better solution for transporting everyone to and from Havant, the hotel and any excursions.

Visitors travelling to Havant by car from the north can take one of two main routes:

M1 / M25 / A3 route:

- 1. Take the M1 south to junction 6a
- 2. Follow the M25 (west) signposted Heathrow to junction 10
- 3. Take the A3 (south) and A3(M)
- Leave the A3(M) and follow the signposts for Havant


M1 / M69 / M40 / A34 / M3 / M27 / A27 route:

- Take the M1 south to junction 21
- 2. Take the M69
- 3. Take the A46
- 4. Take the M40 south-east toward London
- 5. Take the A34 south toward Newbury
- 6. Take the M3 south
- Take the M27
- 8. Take the A27 into Havant

Note: All travel, flights, hotel accommodation, breakfast & evening meals should be arranged and paid for by the attendee – they are *not* included as part of the course price.


